Why Participate in a Children's Choir?

Beginning on Wednesday, August 14, we will once again hear the sweet sound of children singing. We have two choirs for children here at Earle Street: Preschool Choir (ages K3-K5), and Young Musicians (1st-5th grades). Why do we believe children's choirs are important, and why should your child participate?

- Choir teaches discipline. Children focus and work together to learn music.
- Choir teaches working toward a goal. Children work each week to learn their music—not everything is instantaneous.
- Choir teaches using skills. Children are born singers, and choir gives them the opportunity to use that ability.
- Choir, especially at church, teaches children about God. We learn to sing our faith, even before we understand it.
- Choir is fun!

INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN DOCTRINE Leader: Gary Strickland Fellowship Hall
